## Town Project Updates

### Multi-Use Path

The Multi-Use Path along the north side of Old Fayetteville Road from Town Hall Drive to North Brunswick High School has officially opened to the public. Members of the North Brunswick High School cross country team ran through a ribbon to celebrate the opening.



## Streets Resurfacing

The Town is currently in the design phase to resurface the following streets within Town limits:

- \* Olde Waterford Way
- \* Part of Woodwind Drive
- \* Palm Ridge Drive
- \* Old Village Circle
- \* Part of Pine Harvest Drive
- \* Bentgreen Drive
- \* West Gate Drive

- \* Intersection of West Gate Drive and New Pointe Boulevard
- \* Commercial section of Grandiflora Drive

The project includes milling, full depth repairs as needed, and asphalt overlay. Survey using LiDAR mapping has been completed and geotechnical inspection to determine full depth repairs is currently underway. Construction is slated for spring/summer 2022.

## A Safety Message from Leland Fire/Rescue

It's time to change your clock, change your battery, and test your detector!

Newer smoke alarms have longer battery lives, so the focus on annually changing the battery isn't as prevalent, but something we still must remember. There are detectors

that require a battery change at least once a year, preferably twice a year.

Take time to test both your smoke alarm and your carbon monoxide alarm. It's very quick and easy to do and ensures that each device is working properly to alert you to an emergency within your home. Remember to have your exit plan in place and practice. You should know two ways out of each room, two ways out of your house, and have a designated location for your family to meet outside.
