# Town Project Updates

## Old Fayetteville Road Multi-Use Path

The project to install a Multi-Use Path along the north side of Old Fayetteville Road from Town Hall Drive to North Brunswick High School is nearing completion. Remaining work includes installing new street signs and site restoration.



The Town will hold a ribbon cutting ceremony along with NCDOT representatives on Monday, Oct. 18 at 12 p.m. Town residents are welcome.



## Brunswick Forest Roundabout

The single-lane roundabout at Brunswick Forest Parkway and Low Country Boulevard has been constructed and is now open to traffic. This will allow vehicles to keep moving freely and improve pedestrian safety.

## A Safety Message from Leland Fire/Rescue

The focus of this year's Fire Prevention Week, which is Oct. 3-9, is "Learn the Sounds of Fire Safety."



According to the National Fire Protection Association, working smoke alarms in the home reduce the risk of dying in a fire by more than half. However, almost three out of five home fire deaths occur in homes with no smoke alarms or smoke alarms that failed to operate.

Remember the following this Fire Prevention Week:

- You should have working smoke alarms on every floor of your home, including in and outside every sleeping area.
- Check
  - When a smoke alarm or carbon monoxide (CO) alarm sounds, exit the home as quickly as possible.

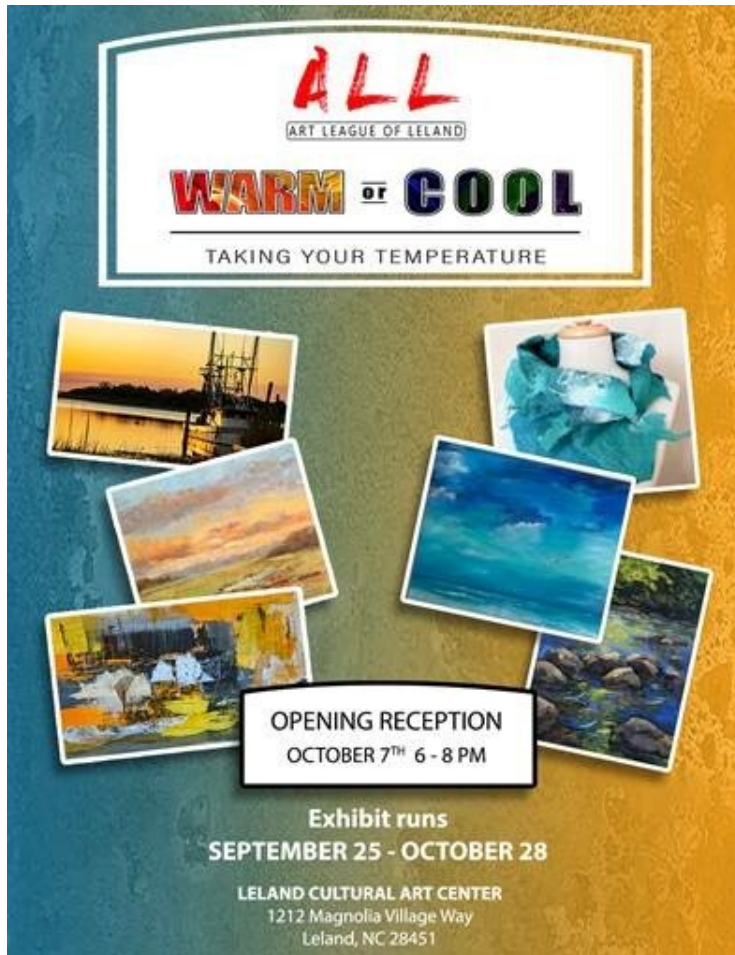
