
Town Project Updates

Olde Waterford Way

The Town is working on the design of the Olde Waterford Way extension. The project will extend the road in Waterford from Palm Ridge Drive to Olde Regent Way. This will alleviate traffic congestion and better serve the developing areas within Waterford. The Town anticipates this project to bid



later this year, with construction starting early 2022.




Brunswick Forest Roundabout

Construction begins in September to install a single-lane roundabout at the intersection of Brunswick Forest Parkway and Low Country Boulevard and restripe both roads. The roundabout will allow

vehicles to keep moving freely and improve pedestrian safety. Restriping will provide better visibility for drivers and pedestrians. Construction is expected to be completed by the end of October.

Applications Needed for Housing Assistance Grant Opportunity

The Town of Leland is considering an application for Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Neighborhood Revitalization funds from the North Carolina Rural Economic Development Division (REDD). The funding would be used to provide rehabilitation or replacement housing assistance to lower-income homeowner households. The program is sponsored by the Town of Leland, with funds potentially provided by REDD.

To apply for the grant, the Town needs applications from residents seeking repairs to their homes. Owner-occupied households with lower incomes residing in substandard housing should contact the Town if they'd like to be considered for a rehabilitation or replacement housing loan (up to 8-year term, 0% interest forgiven loan) offered through the CDBG program.

To be considered for a loan, applicants must meet the criteria outlined inthis information statement. This document also includes three application forms that must be returned to the Town's Director of Planning and Building Inspections **no later than Sept. 10.**



Public Survey: Coastal Resiliency

The Town is seeking public input as part of the Resilient Coastal Communities Program (RCCP) through the North Carolina Division of Coastal Management (DCM). The goal of the project is to enhance resiliency to natural hazards, like flooding and storms, by building a framework to develop and implement a locally driven resilience strategy and implement projects or activities which reduce the impacts of those hazards.

Community engagement is critical to this project. Give us your feedback in this public survey, which will gauge priorities and preferences as a baseline for project plans. Participants will be asked about experiences with disasters caused by natural hazards like flooding, storm surge, and/or erosion.



A Safety Message from Leland Fire/Rescue


With school back in session, our responsibilities change. Buses are back on the roads, so drivers need to take an extra moment to make sure we are doing the following:

 Watch out for children walking or riding bikes to school or waiting for the bus. Stop for school buses flashing their lights. Pay attention to the children, as their focus is

on the bus, not you. Make sure you are following any crossing guard's directions. They are there to protect the children. Park in the correct spots if dropping your child off at school. lt is VERY important that room be left for emergency vehicle access to the building. Be more aware

of your surroundings, especially if you see young ones out and about in the morning as they wait for the school bus. Sharpen your senses as well in the afternoon when seeing the bus in the neighborhood, as they may be getting ready to stop and let а child off.
