## New Fire Station 53 Opens in May



The Town is pleased to announce the opening of Fire Station 53, located at 187 Old Lanvale Road. The site, previously used by the former Town of Leland Streets and Utilities Department, underwent an extensive redesign and renovation, adding approximately 6,000 square feet to the original structure. Improvements include the addition of two 70' pull-through bays, eight sleeping rooms, a kitchen and living space, a fitness room, offices, and a conference room. Along with the building renovation, major improvements were also made to the parking lot, driveways, landscaping, and stormwater systems, creating a space that will serve the needs of the Town of Leland Fire/Rescue Department and Leland residents for years to come.

The opening of Station 53 will address the need for improved response times to emergency events in the rapidly expanding areas around the Highway 17 corridor, greatly improving our network of Public Safety services. Firefighters will begin moving into the new station in May. Details regarding an opportunity for the public to tour the new Station 53 will be announced soon on the Town's website and social media.

## \$33 Million Budget Approved



Leland Town Council approved a \$33 million budget for fiscal year 2022-2023 at its regular meeting in April. Highlights include the following:

- \$30 million general fund budget.
- No tax rate increase.
- 42.2% allocated to Public Safety.
- \$800,000 for a new
  - fire
  - engine.
- 17.7% allocated

to Public Services, which includes the street maintenance division and the Parks, Recreation, and Cultural Resources Department. **\$324,600** in capital equipment for the street maintenance division. More than \$1.6 million for street projects. **\$640,000** in grant proceeds allocated to Founders Park renovations, anticipated to begin in 2023. **1**9 new fulltime

employee positions including four firefighters and one police officer.

"As the Town continues growing rapidly, it's important that our staffing and services rise to meet the community's growing needs," Mayor Brenda Bozeman said. "Leland is a wonderful place to call home, and the goals prioritized in this budget will ensure that it continues to be for years to come."

### **Neighborhood Revitalization Grant Opportunity**



The Town of Leland is considering an application for Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Neighborhood Revitalization funds from the North Carolina Rural Economic Development Division to provide rehabilitation or replacement housing assistance to lower-income homeowner households.

Owner-occupied households with lower incomes residing in substandard housing are encouraged to contact the Town if they would like to be considered for a rehabilitation or replacement housing loan (up to 8-year term, 0% interest forgiven loan) offered through the CDBG program.

To be considered for a loan, applicants must meet the criteria outlined below:

 Applicants must be able to document that they are current on all taxes and obtained clear title to the property to be assisted at the time the Town considers formal applications for CDBG assistance.

All households served must occupy а unit with severe structural deficiencies or severe water and/or sewer needs. This program is designed to address housing needs, not minor structural cosmetic improvements. No rental units or vacant units will be considered for assistance. All units must be located within the corporate limits of

the Town of Leland. See if you live in Town limits. Manufactured housing must have been converted into real property if owned and occupied by the homeowner prior to selection.

If you wish to be considered for CDBG assistance, you must apply no later than **June 14**. Learn more about the program on the Town's website.

**Mosquito Control** 

Town of Leland Public Services employees monitor mosquito activity and respond to service calls from citizens related to mosquitoes through Nov. 1.


Report a mosquito issue in your area and request adulticide spray through Leland 311 or call (910) 371-0148. Once a report is received, a staff member will investigate the report to determine if the area meets the threshold for spray: a landing count of seven per minute. If the area meets the threshold, a truck will be routed to the area to begin spray operations. Spraying will then continue until it appears the outbreak is contained. The frequency of spraying depends on the overall number of areas that need spraying, available manpower, and the severity of the outbreak.

Request spray notification. Request for your residence not to be sprayed. Register as a beekeeper.


 Observe posted speed limits. Slow down

in neighborhoods. The speed limit is likely 25-35 mph. How fast are you going? Let people around you know your intentions by using your turn signals. When passing nonmotorists along our roads, give plenty of space. What if that jogger fell, or the cyclist hit something and lost his/her

#### balance?

There are rules of the road for bicycle riders in North Carolina too. Keep in mind, you also are a moving vehicle and need to observe the same rules as motor vehicles. This keeps us all safe.

- Stay to your right along the edge of the road in the right lane. Don't ride on the Use the hand signals
  - sidewalk.
  - below when turning and
  - stopping.



You MUST come

to а full and complete stop at stop signs. For cyclists and drivers at а fourway stop, it is FIFO: First In, First Out.

Our overall goal is safety. We have all seen close calls on our roadways. Working together, we can all be solutions to the problem instead of the problem itself. This goes for all – walkers, joggers, bike riders, and vehicle drivers. Talk to your friends, neighbors, and strangers and remind them to STAY SAFE while on our streets and sidewalks.






# Sign Up for CodeRED Alerts






