

Supply List:

**Oil paints:** a selection of colors OR acrylic paints  
*with*

**The appropriate medium:** For oil painters, bring cold wax medium, such as Gamblin's.  
For acrylic painters, it's heavy body gel medium.

**Really important:** A silicon bowl scraper:

Messermmeister silicon bowl scraper: highly recommended (\$21).

Or Zoie+Chloe scraper. \$6.99—best buy

Or Princeton Catalyst Silicone wedge (\$8): all available at Amazon;

Or a less-good one from Hobby Lobby (baking section) \$2.99)

**Additional tools:** palette knives, your favorite large brushes; skewer, comb...anything  
for mark-making in your paint

**Assorted surfaces:** Important to have at least two panels. More if you work quickly.  
Keep them small: 8x10 to 11x14, or 10-12" squares are fine. Wood or canvas panels  
work better than stretched canvas for this. OR, paper cut into small panels and taped to  
a board (gesso if needed)

**If you have them:** A soft rubber brayer, little scissors, oil pigment sticks, oil pastels,  
pencils, stencils, stamps, any thin papers/photos for collage.

Palette, apron, solvent for cleanup of oils (such as turpenoid or Gamsol.)

There will be a \$10 fee if paint, tools, and cold wax need to be provided. Bring your own  
panels or paper.
