REFUND POLICY

- If a participant registers online, a refund given for any reason is less the ActiveNet processing fee. The ActiveNet registration software charges a small but non-refundable processing fee for online registrations.
- The ActiveNet system does not allow users to register for a class using an account credit when paying online. When using an account credit, one must come into the LCAC or Town Hall or call so we can apply the credit to the new registration.
- If a participant chooses to have a credit placed on their account, there is no additional processing fee when the participant uses the credit in person to register for a different program.
- Currently, credits do not expire and can be used for anyone on the participant's family account.
- Cancellation/Withdrawal: Participants must cancel their enrollment a minimum of two weeks prior to the program start date to receive a full refund.

Please note that this is only a portion of our refund, credit and transfer policy. Get complete details by calling the facility hosting the program.
