REFUND POLICY

- If participant registers online, a refund given for any reason is less the ActiveNet processing fee. The ActiveNet registration software charges a small but non-refundable processing fee for online registrations. The processing fee can be avoided if one registers in-person.
- The ActiveNet system does not allow users to register for a class using an account credit when paying online. When using an account credit, one must come into the center or call so we can apply the credit to the new registration.
- If participant chooses to have a credit placed on their account, there is no additional processing fee when the participant uses the credit in-person to register for a different program.
- Currently, credits do not expire and can be used for anyone on the participant's family account.
- Cancellation/Withdrawal: Participants must cancel their enrollment a minimum of two weeks prior to the program start date to receive a full refund.

Please note that this is only a portion of our refund, credit and transfer policy. Get complete details by calling the facility hosting the program.

A MESSAGE FROM OUR OPERATION SERVICES DIRECTOR

Exciting things are on the horizon with the adoption of the Parks, Recreation and Open Spaces Master Plan!

In October of 2018, Leland Town Council adopted the Parks, Recreation, and Open Spaces Master Plan performed by GreenPlay LLC. This means Leland now has a guiding document for the future which includes a five year focus on operations, ten year focus on capital items, and a twenty year strategic vision. The plan reflects the recent organizational and programmatic changes and takes into account the most current population data and expected growth of Leland. The PROS Plan also provides a list of goals, objectives, and actions that staff will plan to execute to establish Leland as a premier department. A big thank you goes out to GreenPlay LLC, Sage Design and RCI Associates for their work on this plan.

While there is much work ahead, progress has occurred in other areas such as the new nine hole disc golf course at Municipal Park. This temporary Par 3 course is designed for all ages and experience levels. It has been wonderful to see so many people using it thus far and I hope you will take the time to check it out for yourself. In fact, you can stop by the front desk of Leland Town Hall Monday through Friday between the hours of 8am and 4pm to check out a starter pack of discs by leaving a photo ID while you play. If disc golf is not your thing, then I might suggest the Leland Cultural Arts Center, home to dedicated art studios for classes in painting, pottery, dance and more, in addition to an open art gallery that changes each month.

Whatever you choose I invite you take advantage of the programs, events, and facilities we have to offer. I hope to see you at a park or program in the future.



BASKET WEAVING - REED

Adventures of Basket Weaving ●






