



Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

Where is the site located?

The drop-off site is located at 1987 Andrew Jackson Highway NE, Leland, NC 28451. The entrance to the site is off of Popular Street, which can be accessed from Hwy 74/76 (Andrew Jackson Highway).

What are the hours of operation?

The facility is open Wednesday 8am-4pm and Saturday 8am-12pm, except holidays.

How much does it cost?

Residents must purchase vouchers, IN ADVANCE, to use the site at the price of \$60 for 5 vouchers, or \$100 for 10 vouchers. Vouchers are not sold individually.

How do the vouchers work?

Vouchers are good for one (1) truck or trailer load per voucher. For example, dropping off one truck load of debris, will require the use of 1 voucher. If dropping a truck and trailer load, this will require the use of 2 vouchers. Vouchers are collected by the site attendant prior to disposing of debris.

Where can vouchers be purchased?

Vouchers must be purchased in person at the Town of Leland Municipal Operations Center office, located at 1987 Andrew Jackson Highway NE, Leland, NC 28451, between the hours of 8am-5pm, Monday-Friday, except holidays. Vouchers can be purchased using a credit or debit card only. NO CASH IS ACCEPTED ON SITE.

Can I pay at the time of drop-off?

No, vouchers must be purchased IN ADVANCE at the Town of Leland Municipal Operations Center office.

Who can use the vouchers/site?

The site is only available for use by current Town of Leland residents. Vouchers purchased may only be used by the household of the original purchaser. No transfers are allowed.

I have a business and would like dispose of yard debris at the facility, am I allowed to do so?

No, the site is only for use by Town of Leland residential customers. Commercial debris may not be disposed of at this facility.

What type of debris is accepted?

The site only accepts residential, vegetative yard debris. This includes limbs, leaves, trimmings, grass clippings, stumps, and bushes. All large items such as branches, trees, stumps and bushes, must be cut into manageable size or they will not be accepted. Acceptable yard debris DOES NOT include, sand, dirt, concrete, bricks, lumber, and other construction debris.

What is the unloading process?

Upon entering the site, follow the road to the rear of the facility. A site attendant will greet you, check the items for approval, collect the appropriate number of vouchers, and instruct where the debris is to be unloaded.
